He served his country as a Coxswain during WWII in the Sea Bee branch of the U.S. Navy where he received an honorable discharge January 12, 1946. He was a devoted father who always took the time to assist them in any way possible. His grandchildren were very dear to him, and he loved each of them in his own special way. John enjoyed life to the fullest. He answered the call to serve the Lord by becoming an Ordained Deacon in 1978. He loved his church family unconditionally. Quite the lady's man, he would compliment and tease the "young ladies" of St. Peter Claver from ages two to 102. St. Peter Claver was his life. He was a member of the Fat Attack Club, Holy Name Society, Knights of St. John, Maintenance Committee for the Parish, and Escort for the V.A. Hospital. He claimed St. Peter Claver as his home and helped out wherever he was needed. He humbly spent his life serving his family, his church and his community. Our Lord, Jesus Christ called him home on Father's Day, June 17, 2007. John was

preceded in death by his wife, Catherine, son Darrell, and son-in-law, Edmond Cobbs. He leaves to mourn his children, Berdetta White (George), Alease Cobbs, and Milton Briscoe (Katherine); grandchildren, William, John, Katrina, Danielle, Yolanda, and Cassandra; great-grandchildren; sisters, Selmar Burrell and Ruth Kelly (John); brother, Edward Briscoe (Delores); nieces, nephews and a host of other family members and friends.
