He departed this life on June 29, 2004 after a courageous battle with cancer. Mr. Linton was educated in the Baltimore City Public Schools. Although a great advocate of education, Mr. Linton was forced to interrupt his academic career in order to provide additional financial resources for his family. In 1941, Mr. Linton became an active member of the United States Army. In 1954, Mr. Linton became employed with the Baltimore City Fire Department as a Tiller. As a Baltimore City Firefighter, Mr. Linton sacrificed his life on countless occasions to save the lives and preserve the safety of many Baltimoreans. In 1952, Mr. Linton entered into holy matrimony with Marguerite C. Crump. Mr. and Mrs. Linton were married for forty-nine years until her death in 2001. Mr. Linton was very committed and dedicated to his marriage, which he greatly demonstrated during the months prior to her death. Mr. Linton spent a great deal of his spare time as an avid fisherman. He enjoyed the thrill of bringing home a huge catch after a long day on the Maryland waters. In addition to fishing, Mr. Linton enjoyed home improvement projects, caring for his various canine companions, singing, and listening to a broad selection of musical styles. Mr. Linton was an extremely kind and gentle soul. Many who have had the pleasure of being acquainted with Mr. Linton describe him as a courageous humanitarian who would assist mankind without a second thought. He was a devoted family man who even in his final days expressed concern for the

family he was leaving behind. Mr. Linton leaves to mourn: a daughter, Jo Ann Sophia Anoma; one son-in-law, Felix Moka Anoma; one grandson, David Anoma; one surviving sister, Lorraine Linton; a devoted nephew and niece, Queener and Karen; a dedicated caretaker and friend, Shirley Boyd other nephews and nieces, and a huge array of other relatives and friends.
