JOHN WESLEY DELOATCH, entered into rest and peace on Sunday, December 11, 2011 at Loch Rave Veteran's Center in Baltimore, Maryland at the age of eighty-three years old.

He was born on November 1, 1928 to James and Nannie(Barnes) DeLoatch in Margarettsville, North Carolina. John Wesley was the eighth and youngest son of ten children. His parents and siblings (except one brother) preceded him in death. Because his mother died when he was very young, his older brother, Walter and sister, Clara (Fletcher) took him under thier wings and treated him as if he was their child and continued to do so even after Wesley had left home.

John Wesley joined Mt. Zion Baptist Church in Seaboard, North Carolina as a child, but later relocated ti Baltimore, Maryland to make a better life for himself. After spending a period of of time in Baltimore, he joined the united States Army, served and received an honorable discharge. After his time in the military, he returned to Baltimore to live. During this time, he met and married Alice Washington DeLoatch, the love of his life, who preceded him in death. He remained in Baltimore until his death.
