JOHN EDWARD SAVAGE, JR. was born on December 19, 1917 in Accamack County, Virginia on the Eastern Shore to Mary Lee Boggs Savage and John Edward Savage Sr. John was the eldest son of five brothers and two sisters; David, James, George, Josephine (deceased), Mary, Chalres and Spencer. He was educated in the Accamack County public elementary and junior high schools. He furthered his education in Baltimore, where he attended Douglass Evening High School. John was a veteran of World War II and received an honorable discharge. He resided in Washington, D.C., where he worked in the Pentagon, the FBI and the State Department before obtaining a job with the United States Post Office and subsequently moved to Baltimore. During the time he lived in Washington, he met and married Velter DeJohnette (formerly of Louisiana) in December of 1945. This joyous union resulted in sixty years of marriage and two children; a son, Jack and a daughter, Victoria (Vicki). John had a high standard of work ethics. He worked at his job with the Post Office as a letter carrier while working at times two part time jobs. Some of the places where he worked were: Union Memorial Hospital, A.R.A. Food Services, Airport Van Transportation and BWI Airport Security just to name a few. He loved meeting new people and wasn't shy about holding them captive with his gift for elaborate stories and conversations.
