Moving to Washington, D.C. also was a double blessing to Johnny because that was where he met the love of his life, Demetria (Mimi) Tolson. Johnny and Mimi were married December 17, 1995. Johnny and Mimi's marriage united and strengthened their children Terrinita (Nina), Christopher (who preceded him in death) and Eric as family. John (Mimi always called him "Honey Bump" a.k.a. "Pumpkin Puss") was loved and cared for by his wife. Mimi truly took her vows, in sickness and in health, literally. Johnny was fun loving, patient and liked to spend time with his

grandchildren. Playing sports, card games, bowling and shooting pool were only some of the energetic kinds of things he liked to do. But, make no mistake; watching television with remote always in hand was something he dearly liked as well. He had a strong love of family and could always be counted on to visit his nieces, grandchildren, and cousins and was always there at family gatherings and celebrations.
