This little town of Ninety-Six is also the home of Benjamin Mays, the former Morehouse College President and mentor to Dr. Martin Luther King. John attended Richmond Public Schools, graduating from Armstrong High School in 1951. He then enlisted in the US Navy and was honorably discharged in 1955. John met and married his true love, Barbara in 1956.

"Johnny", as he was called by his family and friends, worked for the City of Richmond-Gas and Water Department and then went to work for the US Postal Service, where he retired after 35 years of service.

Johnny was very active in various organizations. He was a Scout Master with the Boy Scouts of America and joined the Masons, later becoming a Shriner.

John loved the Lord and joined St. Paul's Baptist Church. He was a faithful member for over fifty years. He sang with the Male Chorus and the Mass Choir as well as the Celebration Choir. John was a member of the Refiners ministry. He regularly attended Bible study and worship services.
