In between his touring he returned home to unite with his childhood sweetheart, Jane Gilchrist and invited her to Las Vegas, Nevada to join him in Holy Matrimony; and from this union they had Shantier and Johnathan Kevin Barnes Jr. Kevin attended St. Mary the Virgin Episcopal Church and later joined Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Frank Reid III. During his membership he was active in the Juvenile Justice Ministry and the Men's Bible Study group. He loved to fellowship with the members and to travel with his pastor when he preached. Kevin participated in sports at a very early age, utilizing the Somerset, Lafayette and Chick Webb recreation centers. He also made use of all the playgrounds in the area. He worked various jobs including Commercial Credit Corporation, B. Greene Food Distributor and Key Bank and Trust. Until his sudden call home he was employed at NCO Financial Systems. There was never a dull moment

when Kevin was around, jovial, pleasant and easy to get along with. During the recent illness of his mother, Kevin demonstrated what it meant to be a loving and supportive son.
