Joseph Edward McAlily, one of four children of the late George and Martha McAlily, was born on June 11, 1924, in Winnsboro, South Carolina. He attended public schools in Winnsboro, South Carolina, graduating from Fairfield High School. He received training in Interior Decorating at the VA school. Joseph relocated to Baltimore, Maryland at an early age, seeking employment. He was employed at Bethlehem Steel Company for 38 years, retiring on disability. When Joseph relocated to Maryland he united with Bethel A. M. E. Church and later with Union Memorial Methodist Church. Joseph served in the United States Air Force during World War II for three years. During his tenure he received the Ribbon of Honor for good conduct and the World War II Victory Medal. He was honorably discharged on March 10, 1946, for his dedicated service. He met and married the love his life, Mildred Lee on September 18, 1948, and from that union there were two sons, Joseph Dwight and Zachary Terry, Sr. He was a model husband and father. He worked in the neighborhood for the betterment of the community and his fellow man. Always reaching out to others, Joseph unselfishly gave to help those in need. His special gift for giving touched people in many different ways. He spent endless hours volunteering for the neighborhood Police Boys Club. Joseph was called home to be with the Lord on Tuesday, February 15, 2005. Joseph leaves to rejoice his homegoing: his loving wife, Mildred; caring sons, Joseph Dwight and Zachary Terry, Sr.; daughter-in-law, Gaynell; grandsons, Kareem and Zachary, Jr.; sister, Louise Alexander of South Carolina; brother, George
