JOSEPH EDWARD HERBERT departed this life on October 25, 2005 after a lengthy illness. He was born on February 4, 1918 in Bowie, Maryland to Henry Herbert and Matilda Grayson Herbert Chase, the last of seven siblings. He received his education in Prince Georges' County and graduated from Highland Park High School. Joseph's first employment was with the federal government at the Bureau of Engraving in Washington, D.C., where he worked for fifteen years. Later, he transferred to Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Aberdeen, Maryland, where he remained for eight years. In 1958, he left the government service to venture into the private industry segment at Kopper's Inc. located in Baltimore. There he remained until his retirement in 1981. In 1944 Joseph was united in holy matrimony to Florence G. Milburn. Joseph and Florence traveled extensively throughout the United States, Europe, Asia and Canada. They met many friends and associates. He was a devoted Catholic his entire life and was an active member of New All Saints Catholic Church.
