January 15, 1927 - March 10, 2014

Joseph J. Greene, Jr., peacefully joined the angels of heaven and entered eternal rest on March 10, 2014 with his beloved wife by his side. He was born January 15, 1927 to the late Lillian Banks Greene and Joseph J. Greene, Sr. in Richmond, Virginia. He is preceded in death by his two sisters, Mary G. Hite and Lillian G. Battle.

At the age of twelve, he accepted Jesus Christ and was baptized at Fifth Street Baptist Church. Joseph was educated in the Richmond Public School System and graduated from Armstrong High School, Class of 1944. He furthered his education at Virginia Union University with an interest in ministry. He was called to serve his country and completed a tour of duty in the Korean War. Joseph received an honorable discharge in 1956. He later enrolled in Barber School where he received his license.

On February 25, 1965, he was united in holy matrimony to the love of his life, Roberta Price and together they raised a son, Ronald.

He was employed with Martin Chevrolet before accepting a position with the United Postal Service, where he was a letter carrier. Joseph retired in 1987 after 30 years of dedicated service. He was also the founding owner of Klean Inc. Joseph was Past Master of Hobson Lodge #23, a member of the Elizabeth Harris Chapter #86 (OES), and a member of the Astoria Beneficial

Club, and NALC #496.

Throughout his lifetime, he faithfully attended church and served on the Usher's Ministry, Music Ministry and the Agape Sunday School Class while being a long-time member of Fifth Street Baptist Church. His strong faith in Jesus Christ would later lead him to St. Paul's Baptist Church, where he was again baptized. Joseph served with the Refiner's Ministry, attending until his health began to fail.

He leaves to mourn a devoted and loving wife of 49 years, Roberta P. Greene; son, Ronald (Debra); three grandchildren; five great-grandchildren; a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and other loving relatives.
