Life here on earth is given to us temporarily by God, and with this life He gives each of us a wound-up clock. When the time clock stops, God opens the portals and beckons one to come in - so it was with JOSEPH LLEWELLYN DAVAGE, born June 18, 1921 and departed this life April 12, 2006 at Heritage Harbour Rehabilitation Center after a long illness. He was the first son of six children born to the late Anna E. and John H. Davage. Joseph received his education through the Baltimore City Public Schools. Mr. Davage served in the United States Army during World War II, was wounded in Italy and awarded the Purple Heart. After his honorable discharge he became certified in tailoring at Hampton Institute, Hampton, Virginia and married Lelia Lucille Freeman in 1945. He has been employed as a skilled laborer, teacher and tailor, and was a retiree in 1978 from the United States Postal Service. Mr. Davage was a member of Our Lady of the Fields Catholic Church, member and past president of the Netman-Coed Tennis Club, Chi Eta Phi Booster and ATA life member. His interests included love for his family, home, tennis, organ-playing, dancing, sewing, cooking, ceramics, crocheting, macrame, painting, traveling and entertaining. Fondly called "Llewellyn" by family and friends, he leaves to mourn: his beloved wife of sixty years, Lelia Lucille Davage; his daughter, Agnes Renata Davage; son, Andre Kurt Davage; four grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren. He is also survived by three sisters, Bernadette E. Goode, Anna G. Johnson and Evangeline C. Pearson all of Baltimore. Other survivors include two brothers-in-law, James Pearson

of Baltimore, David W. Freeman of Oakland, Calif.; aunt, Eleanor Banks of Washington, D.C.; nieces, nephews, cousins and many friends.
