JOSEPH SCOTT, SR., was born on November 5, 1945, the 11th child of Doctor and Ola Mae Scott. Joe had 11 siblings including five sisters and six brothers. Doctor and Ola Mae raised their children on 22nd Street in East Baltimore. Even at a young age, Joseph was diligent, hard working, and had a deep appreciation for family. At an early age, Joe's dearest friend, Carlos Kellum, lead him to Christ.

Joe was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System and graduated from Carver Vocational High School in 1964. He was a natural athlete, sports enthusiast, and a member of the Carver football and wrestling teams. Joe had a true passion for sports, football in particular.

After graduating high school, Joe furthered his education at Morgan State University. He worked while earning his bachelor's degree in history. It was at Morgan State University where Joe met Sharon G. Coleman; who was the love of his life and became his wife of 50 years. Joe and Sharon had two children, Joseph Scott Jr., and Kristin A. Brown. Joe and Sharon loved to travel and enjoyed taking romantic getaways to Niagara Falls and Ocean City.

Joe continued to play football during and after college, as he joined the Baltimore Rams Semi-Pro Football Team. After

college, Joe began his career in the meat cutting industry at A&P Supermarket. Joseph was an active member in the United Food and Commercial Workers Union where he served as a local shop leader. After 42 years of being a meat cutter, Joe retired in 2013 from Giant Supermarket.

Family was the most important thing to Joseph and he was a devoted son, husband, father, brother, uncle, and friend. Joe often read the Bible to his children on Sunday mornings after making a big breakfast. This love for family extended to his nieces, nephews, and community. Joe was known for packing his car full of kids on a hot summer's day and taking them to Gun Powder Beach to cool off and enjoy the summer sun. Joe coached his son in Little League Baseball and became an amateur photographer to capture his daughter at her dance recitals. In Joe's latter years, he gained joy from watching his grandchildren play sports whether it was football, tennis, soccer, baseball, track and field, or cross country.
