September 3, 1950 - June 28, 2025

On the morning of Saturday, June 28, 2025, in her home in Gwynn Oak, Baltimore County, Maryland, our beloved Joycelyn Griffith departed this world unexpectedly. As we gather in remembrance, we celebrate not only a life well lived but a spirit that brought light and love to everyone she met.

Born on September 3, 1950, in the quiet southern town of Siparia, Trinidad and Tobago, Joycelyn Cooper was the vibrant daughter of George and Diana Cooper. She was the cherished middle child among nine siblings: Lynette Quan-Soon, Kenrick, Leont, Isabella†, Kelwin†, Ralph†, Joseph, and Marlene Christopher. Her childhood was marked by laughter, games, books, and schooldays — a tapestry of simple joys woven through the countryside where she grew up. Her stories, rich with the rhythm of island life, painted vivid pictures of her younger years spent playing and learning alongside her brothers and sisters.

Joycelyn's journey took her from the rustic charm of Siparia to the bustling urban life of Port of Spain and Arima. There, alongside her husband and two sons, she built a home filled with dreams and determination. In 1974, on the beautiful island of Tobago, she met the love of her life, James A. Griffith. They were married on November 2nd of that year and welcomed two sons: Jerome Mathias and Joel Edward.

In 1989, Joycelyn took a bold step of faith, moving to the United States in pursuit of greater opportunities for her family. Baltimore, Maryland became her new home — a place where she would face new challenges and triumphs with courage and grace. She worked diligently in the healthcare field, serving as a CNA, GNA, Med Tech, and nurse, providing care and compassion to countless patients throughout her career.

Her faith was the cornerstone of her life. A devoted born-again Christian, Joycelyn became a beloved member of New Solid Rock Fellowship Church in 2013. Her gentle spirit, warm smile, and giving heart touched every soul she encountered.

Joycelyn was not only a mother and wife — she was also a devoted grandmother, aunt, sister, and friend.
