Our loved one was born JULIA CATHERINE SPEAKS, one of eleven children, nine of whom survived, born to Mary Ann and Alfred Louis Speaks in Nassawadox, Virginia, on the Delmarva Peninsula. She was educated in Virginia, New Jersey, and Baltimore, Maryland, where she graduated from the Frederick Douglass night school. Julia was a domestic worker. In 1940, Julia married the late Frederick Williams of Hampton, Virginia. They had sixteen blissful years together until he departed this life in 1956. Julia gave her life to the Lord at New Allen Chapel in Franktown, Virginia, at the age of twelve. She continued her service to the Lord at Payne Memorial A.M.E. Church in Baltimore where she was a Sunday School teacher and the Sunday School treasurer. It was while serving in Payne Sunday School that Julia met her second husband, the late Llewellyn Young. They were married in the early 1960s and had many happy years together until his death in 1988. Although Julia was not blessed with children of her own, she had a host of nephews and nieces who loved her dearly and who mourn their loss. Julia is survived by five of her sisters, Mary McGuire, Dorothy Henson, Armenella Morris, Thelma White, and Hilda Speaks. Three of her siblings, Rosina Wiggins, Margaret Russell, and Alfred Speaks, Jr., preceded her in death.
