Julia Mae Williams was born on July 9, 1941 to the late Mary Ann Arrington Perry and the late John Plummer Perry. She departed this life on Sunday, February 20, 2005 at her home in Dover, Delaware after suffering a lengthy illness. She received her education from Vaughan Elementary School in Vaughan, N.C. and North Warren High School in Wise, N.C. She received further educational training at the Baltimore City Nurses Training School, Baltimore, Md., and continued at the U.S. Public Hospital Medical Academy, Baltimore, Maryland. She was married and separated from Gilbert Thomas in 2002. She has received numerous certificates in the area of substance abuse prevention and has founded a spiritual intervention/prevention process called "The Spiritual Approach to Alcohol and Other Drugs of Abuse". She became a guest presenter at many conferences and a lecturer at many of the historically Black Colleges and Universities across the country. She was also offered an Honorary Doctorate Degree from Howard University in Washington, D.C.
