On Friday, March 14, 2003 at 8:13 A.M. Julian (Cee) Prout departed this life at the University of Maryland Medical Systems after a lengthy illness. Julian was the son of Ionia Stella Prout and the late Oscar Jones. He was educated in the Baltimore City Public School, and graduated from Douglas High School in 1959. He continued with his education and received the AA certificate from the Lincoln Technical Institute in electronics. Julian met Delores Dean in 1961, and they were united in marriage on September 19, 1964. Of this union; there are three sons; Julian (Jay), Matthew, and Vernon. At an early age, Julian accepted Christ at Unity Christian Church under the spiritual leadership of the late Reverend Levi Miller Sr. He continued to worship there under the leadership of Reverend Dr. Kwame Abayomi, which is now called Unity United Methodist Church. Julian was the Chairman of the Trustee Board for 2 years, and a member of the Senior Church Choir. Julian worked for the United States Postal Service for 39 years and 7 months until illness caused him to retire in 2002. He was a great conversationalist, and enjoyed helping and teasing you. He leaves to cherish his memory: his devoted wife, Delores (Dee); three sons, Jay, Matthews, and Vernon; a loving mother, Ionia Stella Prout; two sisters, Barbara and Jane Kelly; five brothers-in-law, Reverend; six sisters-in-law; two special cousins, Ralph and Lowell Prout, and a host of other nieces, nephews, relative and
