Julius Lott, son of Willie and Sophie Lott, was born on April 1, 1919 in Hancock County, Georgia. He departed this life on December 27, 2003 after a lengthy illness. He received his education at Union High School in Hancock County, Georgia. At the age of twenty-one he joined the United States Army and served in World War II for four years. Upon completion of serving in the military the civil services employed him for thirty-five years. He gave his life to Christ at an early age at the Macedonia Baptist Church. Upon moving to Baltimore, Maryland, he was united with Southern Baptist Church under Rev. Nathaniel Higgs, Pastor. He was very active in the Sunday School Department and later served as a trustee on the Trustee Board. He married the former Maggie Bass in December of 1945. Julius was known for his memory and his ability to remind us of our family tree. He was the historian of our family. He leaves to mourn: his wife, Maggie B.
