Jurisha graduated from Stanton High School in Jacksonville, Florida. Prior to her attending college, she completed night school for nursing aide at Lexington Terrace and was employed at Lutheran Hospital. She also worked as a teacher's aide at Lexington Terrace Elementary School. While working at Lexington Terrace, she attended the Community College of Baltimore and completed her undergraduate degree at Morgan State University. She later received her Master's Degree in Education from the University of Baltimore in Baltimore, Maryland. Jurisha taught fifth grade specializing in Mathematics at Eutaw-Marshburn for several years before retiring.
