She received her formal education in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and continued to achieve a Bachelors degree in Science at Cheyney University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1976 in elementary education. Cheyney University is the oldest of the Historically Black Colleges and Universities in America. She started her teaching career in 1986-1996 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Ms. Gainey relocated to Richmond, Virginia in 1996 to accept a job with Richmond Public Schools. Karen enjoyed the simple yet finer things in life. She loved to learn and always stressed the importance of education. Her interests and hobbies include gardening, traveling with her two boys, caring for animals of every variety, decorating her home, spending time with the family & friends, and most of all, curling up in a cozy spot with a great book. Karen's love, kindness, generosity, and true friendship were felt by many including her students. She always considered people's feelings and offered a helping hand where she could. Karen "Quiet Wolf" was very closely involved in her Native American heritage. A descendent of the Mattaponi and Pamunkey tribes of the great Powhatan Confederacy, where she lived by the Sacred Instructions given by the creator to Native People at the time of creation. She often referred to this

Native American Prayer. "Oh Great Spirit, Grant that I may never find fault with my neighbor, Until I have walked the trail of life in his moccasins." She leaves to mourn two sons, Araine Gainey-Young and Kristian Tyrell Gainey-Young; a granddaughter, Ataura J. Young; two brothers, Clyde Dungee Gainey & Carey Lessene; a host of nieces, nephews, relatives, and friends.

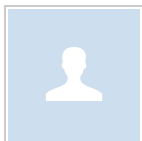
