KATHERINE REDMAN NANCE, mother of Stephanie R. Arnold, was born on April 7, 1918, in Tyrone, Pennsylvania. She departed this life on March 1, 2007. Katherine enlisted in the United States Navy in December 1944 and served through January 1946. She received an honorable discharge on January 7, 1946. Katherine was the first African American Woman, from the state of Pennsylvania, to be admitted into the United States Navy. She served forty years working for the Veterans Administration located in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. During her life in Philadelphia, she became very involved with working with the youth in her community. Katherine devoted a lot of her time to the youth program of the Police Athletic League (P.A.L.) in West Philadelphia. Because of her devotion to her community, she will be missed by many of the people to whom she dedicated her life. She leaves to mourn: her daughter, Stephanie R. Arnold; a son-in-law, David S. Arnold, M.D.; and a grandson, Alexander S. Arnold.
