Katherine Mae Scott (nee Jackson), affectionately known as “Kitty”, departed this life on August 12, 2010. She was born on July 30, 1920 (the sixth of eighth children) to the late Harry and Vergie Jackson in Boyd, Maryland. She came to Baltimore as a child, receiving her education in the Baltimore City Public Schools.

Katherine was married to the late Elisha B. Scott in 1958. Out of this union they raised her sons Gerald B. Williams and Kareem Abdul Ali. Katherine began her nursing training at Maryland General Hospital in 1960. She loved her profession as a Private Duty Nurse, serving the sick tirelessly and with dedication.
