Schools, as a Substitute Teacher and Instructional Assistant. She found great joy in teaching her Kindergarten students new skills. While at their next duty station of Okinawa, Japan, Kathy devoted her time to being a loving and protective Mother to Philip. After traveling and several more moves she returned with her family to Maryland, where they resided in the Fort Meade area, eventually settling in Millersville, Maryland.
