After college, she worked as an English Assistant at Bowie State University. She also worked at Morgan State University in Baltimore, Maryland, in the Human Resources and IT departments. Continuing her work experience, Kelli held the position as a "Digitization Asset Specialist" and "Photographer" at Morgan State University Art Museum.

Kelli loved to travel. Her first traveling experience outside of the United States was as a missionary in South Korea teaching English. She traveled to China to study their culture. Her last trip abroad was to Columbia, South America. While traveling in the United States, she took long road trips visiting friends in South Carolina, North Carolina, Georgia, Virginia, Wisconsin, and New York. She also drove to New Jersey to audition for "American Idol".

Kelli enjoyed many things and believed she could do almost anything. She had the opportunity to go skydiving which is an experience she cherished. Some other things she enjoyed were cooking, painting, photography, singing, writing poetry, and reading the Bible.
