From Novella he learned to be family oriented. From Donald he learned charisma. From Tony (who passed in July, 2002) he learned to be energetic. From Juanita he learned determination. From Eric he learned boldness. There were nine of us before him, and there are nine fruit of the spirit (Galatians 5:22-23). Though he learned a lot from the family, he learned more from the scriptures. He could definitely relate to "longsuffering." He discovered that "every man shall bear his own burden."
