Kimlyn Leonus Sinaswee was born in Carapachima, Trinidad and Tobago to Philomen and Akuchow Sinaswee on June 28, 1919. She grew up in the village of St. Mary's, then moved to San Fernando. After finishing school she attended the Victoria Institute and became a seamstress. She migrated to the United States in 1969, where she worked at the then Friendship Airport. She pursued a certificate as a dietary assistant from the then Community College of Baltimore and began working at Provident Hospital, from which she later retired.

Kimlyn was well known in the local Trinidad and Tobago community for organizing bus trips and selling Avon. She attended St. Ambrose Catholic Church and was a member of the Helping Hands Committee, the St. Vincent DePaul Society and the International Committee. At church "Miss Kim" was known for her fund raising activities, in particular for her 50/50 raffles at various church events
