Kirk Alan Randolph was born in Richmond, VA on January 28, 1968 to Alma B. Randolph and the late Bernard M. Randolph, Sr. He transitioned peacefully on August 6, 2013 surrounded by his family and close friends.

Kirk attended New Kent public schools and furthered his education at J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College. After completing his education, he entered into cosmetology profession, became a licensed hair stylist and practiced for over 25 years. He owned and operated Salon Papillion where his clients came as much for the hair styles as they did for the joy, laughter and sheer entertainment. For his older customers, it was not uncommon for him to pick them up for services and return them home with a pit-stop at the grocery store.

Kirk not only relished the time he spent in the salon, but he also had great relationships with his relatives, friends and church families (Second Liberty and St. Peter). He enjoyed golfing with his close buddies and traveling to new and exciting places. Despite the challenges of sickle cell disease, he lived a full and successful life.

On August 28, 1999, Kirk married Wanda Cauthorne of Tappahannock, VA. They shared a beautiful life together for almost 14 years. Their best times were spent appreciating the simple things in life...taking walks in the

evenings, quiet dinners on the deck and visiting quaint bed and breakfasts in various states. At home, Kirk would often recreate the many recipes prepared by the chefs.

He will be greatly missed, and his impact will be felt by the many lives he touched.

Kirk leaves to cherish his memory a loving and devoted wife, Wanda C. Randolph; caring mother, Alma B. Randolph; two sisters, Sherry Anderson(Frank) and Tamara Dabney;brother, Bernard M.
