She was member of St. Paul's Baptist Church, under the leadership of Dr. Lance Watson and served in the Aids Ministry. LaShaun believed in giving back to her community and lived out that belief through her actions. She was a dedicated change agent who delighted in cheer leading others to becoming the best they could be. As a woman of faith, LaShaun

believed in relying on God's true destination for our life no matter how many wrong turns were taken in the past. LaShaun was a much sought after speaker at churches, national conferences, and community events. Wherever she was invited to speak, she communicated a message of hope, health, wellness, and commissioned people to get involved in the fight for social change and against health disparities. LaShaun was very devoted to her daughter, grandson, brothers and friends. She was a kind-hearted, giving person who had an infectious smile and a joyous spirit. All visitors were welcomed into her home.
