Laura Leuvenia Wilkins (also known as Nookie), beloved daughter of the late Irene Regan and the late Charles H. Carter, was born on December 2, 1932 in Northumberland County, Virginia. She was called home to be with the Lord on October 28, 2014 after a lengthy illness.

Laura was educated in the Baltimore City Public School system. She made a multitude of friends wherever she went, and had lifelong friendships that grew from her schools, neighborhoods, employment at The Wagon Wheel, The Warwick Lounge, Ryder, Inc., her Secret Pals Club, church congregations, and many other affiliations. She found her way to federal contractor Ryder, Inc. at the Federal Depot in Middle River, MD, where she enjoyed a long tenured career as a shipping clerk for nearly 40 years.

Throughout her life, Laura's devotion to the Lord was evidenced by her praise and worship at the Simmons Memorial Baptist Church, which ultimately carried

its Fremont/Lanvale location, and evolving to its current home on Monroe Street in

Baltimore City.

In the late 1940's Laura met George H. Newman, Sr. and from this union, George H.

Newman, Jr. (also known as Peanut) was born. In February 1956, Laura married

Samuel E. Wilkins (also known as Steep) in Baltimore, MD. He preceded her in death.

Laura was a devoted daughter, sister, aunt, grandmother, great-grandmother, and

friend. These relationships meant the world to her. She was in her glory when she was

amongst her family and friends laughing, smiling and enjoying good times together.
