Laurence Prentiss Diggs, Sr., the third of five children, born on July 2, 1930 to the late George Augustus Diggs and Agrada Deaver Diggs, departed this life on Sunday, March 21, 2004 in Towson, Maryland. He followed in passing, his brother George A. Diggs, Jr., sister Janis Diggs Langley, and son, Kirk Anthony Diggs. Laurence received his formal education in the Baltimore City Public School System. Following high school, Laurence joined the U S Army enlisting on July 24, 1950, right after the outbreak of the Korean War. He had a strong desire to join his brothers, George and Louis who were serving in Korea, but military regulations prohibited the assignment to a war zone of all sons in a family, and Laurence was then sent to serve in the 169th Infantry Regiment in Germany. Following an honorable discharge from the military on July 23, 1953, he began work as a truck driver for several years until joining the old Baltimore Transit Company, which later became the Maryland Transit Authority, where after serving thirty years as a bus driver and supervisor he retired. Following retirement, Larry's devotion to the Lord, led him to the Eucharistic ministry at the Villa of St. Michaels, ministering to the elderly. He also enjoyed working for the Bell Bus Company driving senior's citizens to racetracks and other places. Laurence with his camcorder was the life of many a party. His zest for life and fun loving spirit will be sorely missed. With great sorrow Laurence leaves to cherish his memory his wife, Hazel Boyd Diggs, his children, Laurence P.
