LaVita gave her life Jesus as a young child and she continued her spiritual growth at True Deliverance Ministries of Baltimore, Md. family card games, fashion and bowling. She was lovingly known as Bunny, Mommy, Nanny, GiGi, Fancy, Diva; and she lived those roles to the fullest. She truly enjoyed all music, but gospel was her all-time favorite. She thoroughly enjoyed cooking, especially her famous shrimp stuffed crab cakes.
