Lawrence Johnson Sr., son of the late Idina Woods and Norman Johnson, was born on May 3, 1925 in Darlington, South Carolina. He departed this life on Thursday, March 18, 2004 after a brief illness. He received his education in the Darlington, S.C. and Laurinburg, N.C. school systems. At the age of 20 he was drafted into the U.S. Army. After basic training he was sent to Germany to serve his country for eight months during the World War II Occupation. He received an honorable discharge from the Army on November 9, 1946. Upon his return to Laurinburg, he married his high schools sweetheart, Edith Davis. From this union, four children were born, his only daughter Linda and three sons, Lawrence Jr., Angus Norman and Stephen. All three sons predeceased him. He moved his family to Baltimore, Maryland in 1955, where he accepted employment at the Bethlehem Steel Corporation. He worked at Beth Steel until 1968. "Ponderosa" as he was called by many made friends wherever he went and will be sincerely missed by everyone who knew him.
