MR. LEE FRANK CROSBY, SR., affectionately known as Frank, departed this life suddenly in the early morning of April 19, 2025 in Baltimore. Frank was born July 3, 1950 in Anderson County, South Carolina to the late Mr. Roy Crosby and the late Mrs. Mary Anna Peyton Crosby. Like the rest of the family, he was a member of the Wilson Calvary Baptist Church of Anderson, South Carolina.
