LEE A. THOMAS, son of the late John and Bertha Wilks Thomas was born on June 15, 1931 in Emporia, Virginia. He departed this life suddenly on February 14, 2011.

He spent his early childhood in Emporia and attended Greensville County Public Schools. He later moved to Baltimore, Maryland and attended school there. Lee confessed his belief in God and joined the Church of God on Edmonson Avenue and was baptized by Rev. Jake Butler, Sr.

He met and married Gerdell Rooks on September 10, 1966, who preceded him in death. To this union no children were born.
