May 9, 1980 - February 4, 2007

Lekisha Nichelle Thomas was born on May 9, 1980 in Baltimore, Maryland. Lekisha, better known as Kisha, departed this life on Sunday, February 4, 2007 at her home. Her passing came after a long and arduous battle with illness. Raised in a Christian household, Kisha gave her life to Christ during her late teens. She was a member of the New Jerusalem Baptist Church, Baltimore, Maryland. She was a nurse at New Jerusalem and attended bible study. Born in Anne Arundel County, Kisha attended Anne Arundel County Public schools and graduated from North County High School, located in Linthicum, Maryland, in 1998. Kisha also was a Geriatric Nursing Assistant as well as a licensed barber. Kisha loved people, particularly children and older persons. Her interest in people, quick wit and sometimes quirky retorts and remarks (e.g., “Why do you need to know that? “Grandma, please stop “piddling”!, “Sit down, rest yourself!”) endeared her to family, friends and co-workers alike. For five years prior to her illness, Kisha worked at the Harbor Hospital Adult Day Care Center. After contracting her illness, Kisha continued, when her health allowed her, to interact with the Harbor Adult Daycare clients at various events and affairs. Kisha’s strong-willed personality, inner-directedness and her personal relationship with God helped, immensely, during her illness. She remained positive and upbeat throughout her illness. Sometimes offering comfort to those who were not as upbeat and optimistic as she. She did not abide sadness and discontentment in her presence. To say that she will be missed, by many, is a vast understatement. However, as

survivors we know that God is the final arbiter. Preceding Kisha in death were her paternal grandfather-James R. Thomas, Sr., her maternal grandfather-Louis Moore, Jr. and an aunt-Marilynn Ellen Thomas. Kisha is survived by her parents-James R. and Millie Thomas, a brother-Richard Campbell, two grandmothers-Maggie Moore and Ellen Thomas, godmother, Barbara McGee; six uncles, two aunts and a host of cousins, friends and co-workers.
