He was affiliated with the original Sandtown Neighborhood Reunion group that helped to involve the Stricker, Lafayette and Calhoun street neighbors in the Afro-American Clean Block Association contest. O'Neil and Robert Reed; and a host of nephews, nieces, other relatives and friends.
