



Lennon L. Franklin Jr

October 3, 1935 - September 3, 2024

LENNON LEE FRANKLIN, JR. was born to the late Mr. Lennon Lee Franklin, Sr., and the late Mrs. Ida Mae Beachum in Emporia, VA on October 8, 1935. In conflict, the military officially recognized his birthday as October 9, 1935, and so did he. To add to the confusion, Lennon told his daughter that his birthday was

October 27th, and they celebrated his birthday on October 27th until he was at least 75 years old. This is one example of his humor. It came quick and easy for him.

Lennon was called “Sonny” by his family and “Frank” by his close friends. He attended Alexander Hamilton Vocational High School in New York City. He graduated and received his diploma in 1954. Immediately afterward, he enlisted in the United States Air Force. He proudly served during the Korean War into the beginning of the Vietnam War, where he was recognized for his service. After receiving an honorable discharge, he settled in Harlem where he met, and married Anna Franklin and they raised four children. The marriage was dissolved after many years, but they communicated and remained great friends until the end of his life. Lennon later met Martha (Keisha) Ann Bland and had one child. He mourned the untimely passing of Keisha on November 24, 1998, until the end of his life.

Lennon was innately smart and worked in various professions throughout the

early part of his life, but he found his calling later as a true-born entrepreneur! He knew how to be “creative” in business and established a successful career in real estate buying and flipping houses long before it was popular on HGTV. Lol! In his illness, he even asked his daughter to call the owner and see how much she wanted to sell “the building” hospital because it was a “money maker.” He enjoyed being what he jokingly called himself, “a Bossman.” He loved challenging work and was not afraid of it. However, more than that, he loved helping people who needed a hand. If he saw you trying, he would help! He loved his community and employed several people who lived in it. In turn, they respected and worked hard for him. They all looked out for each other.

Lennon was preceded in death by his sisters Lena Carter, Dorothy-Mae Boney, and Stella Matthews, his brothers Estea Franklin and Thomas Franklin, and his son Gregory Franklin.

Lennon leaves to cherish his memory: his sons, Leon Franklin, Raymond Franklin, Gary Franklin, Chris Franklin, and Charron Franklin; his devoted daughter, DeLinda Woodson; grandchildren, Genesis Franklin, Miracle Franklin, Damont Phipps, Chris Phipps; his dear and precious last remaining sister, Mary Lambert.
