Her family always looked forward to her breakfast buffet, especially her homemade waffles and huge delicious sausages. Realizing the importance of family gatherings, she founded "game night", which is a tradition that continues today. She had a laugh that was contagious and a smile that lit up a room. Even during her long period of

illness, she remained jovial and upbeat. Her favorite hobby was completing any type of puzzle, especially the 1,000 piece puzzle. There were times when we could not eat at the kitchen table because she used that space as her work area.
