He departed this life on Monday, November 23, 2009 at the Veterans Maryland Health Care System. Leon was educated in the Baltimore Public School System. As a young man, he realized he needed to earn a living to take care of himself, and he worked at several jobs to include Bethlehem Steel. At the onset of WW II, he volunteered his services as an air raid Warden. He enlisted in the U.S Army-Air Force in 1942. He served and received an honorable discharge in 1945. Upon departure from a military, he acquired employment with the B & O Railroad, and later, American Smelting, where he retired. In 1947, Leon married Louise Hamlette-Logan. He became a loving father to her 5 children: Barbara (Babs), Ernest (Snooky), Anita (chi-chi), Leonard (Porky), and Cynthia. Leon and Louise had three daughters together: Beverly, Nancy and Judith. After Louise's death, Leon held the family together. Leon kept abreast of current events as he had to read the newspaper from cover to cover daily. He enjoyed completing crossword puzzles, and gaming. He shared his birthday with his niece Phaedra whom he affectionately called his "birthday baby".
