Leonard Wellington Jackson was born on April 20, 1950, Havre de Grace Maryland, to the late Samuel Jackson Jr., and Gwendolyn (Matthews) Jackson. He departed this life on December 4, 2023.

Leonard joined the Marines in 1969. He was awarded the Purple Heart medal of honor at the end of his service to our country.

He was employed at the Bethlehem Steel Corporation and attended Coppin State University to receive his Bachelor of Science degree in History. After retiring from Bethlehem Steel he pursued his Master's Degree at Morgan State University, and was unable to complete his Master's due to his heart condition.

Many knew him as "Sensi." An 8th Degree Black Belt in Karate and instructor, he was also a gentle and kind soul that offered assistance to any person he knew.

Leonard married Sharron Jackson on December 26, 1987, and they described their marriage as two imperfect souls who were perfect to each other.
