



Leonard E. Quickley

April 7, 1933 - April 11, 2017

LEONARD W. QUICKLEY, husband of the late Florine G. Quickley, son of the late Lloyd Eugene and Gladys Quickley, departed this world after a brief illness on April 11, 2017 at the Baltimore VA Medical Center at the age of 84 with his loved ones at his side.

Leonard (Poppop), was born in Phoenix, Maryland. He graduated from Douglass Senior High School in 1949. On March 25, 1952 he enlisted in the U.S. Army where he received his higher education. He served in the Korean War from September 1952 to October, 1953. In December 1953, he enlisted in the 457th AAA BN Army Reserves from January, 1954 to May 1963. In November 1963, he enlisted in the 16th SF BN (ABN) MDARNG in Towson, MD until February 1979. Later in February 1979, he transferred to State Headquarters, 5th Regime Army National Guard in Baltimore, Maryland until his retirement in 1987 as Command Sergeant Major. Leonard had a high Operations & Intelligence Security Clearance. He received many awards and decorations; Combat Infantry Badge, National Defense Medal w/3 Bronze Stars, Korean Citation, Parachute Badge, 10 year Armed Forces Reserve Medal, Sr./Master Parachute Badge, Sergeants Major Award and Sharpshooters Medal just to name a few. Poppop served in the Special Forces, Master Parachute and Airborne Rangers.

Poppop was a Baltimore City Firefighter from the 1960' s until 1992 when he retired. He also joined the Masonic Masons, Hiram Grand Lodge, Baltimore, Maryland. Upon retirement Poppop devoted his time to Ed Waters Track Club, Baltimore, Maryland where his granddaughter Vernesse Quickley was a track member for 11 years.

He leaves to cherish his memory: sister, Dorothy Mae Morrison of Fayetteville, North Carolina; one son, Michael Quickley of McKinney, Texas; two devoted daughters, Lenora Quickley-Hazen of Fort Worth, Texas and Deborah Quickley of Baltimore, Maryland; one son-in-law, Robert Hazen; one daughter-in-law, Renee Pompey-Quickley; six grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren; eleven great-greatgrandchildren; and a host of nieces, cousins, Baltimore City Track Clubs and dear friends.
