Leonia attended the public schools in White Stone, Virginia. She received Christ as her Personal Savior at an early age and was baptized at the Mount Vernon Baptist Church in White Stone, Virginia, under the pastorate of Reverend Clow. After relocating to Baltimore she united with the Shiloh Baptist Church under the leadership of Rev. Timothy Boddie, where she served for over fifty years.
