LEROY ISAAC OSBORNE, son of Elizabeth Howard and the late Isaac Osborne, was born on November 27, 1951 in Baltimore, Maryland.

He received his high school diploma from Baltimore City College and attended Morgan State. Leroy enlisted into the United States Air Force and served for eight years as an Aircraft Maintenance Technician and an Electrician, rising to the rank of Staff Sergeant (SSGT). While serving he received: Small Arms Expert Marksmanship Ribbon, National Defense Service Medal, Air Force Good Conduct Medal with one Oak Leaf Cluster and the Air Force Longevity Service Ribbon with one Oak Leaf Cluster. After leaving the military, he worked for a telecommunications company for many years before becoming a Car Maintenance Operator for The Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) from which he would eventually retire.

Leroy loved music, particularly Jazz, and played the guitar. His favorite song was "Lovely Day" by Bill Withers. He enjoyed watching sports, movies, playing chess and basketball and being with his grandchildren.
