### Obituary

Levert Roger Lewis was born to the union of the late Elizabeth and Charles “Charlie” Lewis on January 26, 1944. He went home to be with the Lord on January 17, 2014.

Levert accepted Christ at an early age and received his early training and membership at Cedar Street Baptist Church under the leadership of Dr. Benjamin Robertson. Levert was also a real estate investor and maintained excellent properties throughout Richmond.

Leveret retired from AAFES as a long-distance driver. He retired with a perfect driving record. He often spoke fondly of his adventures and the many wonderful friends he had with this company. He loved to travel in his leisure time and enjoyed showing others the world he had experienced. Leveret found pleasure in things others often overlook such as Christmas lights, plants, and history (especially civil rights). Just before his homegoing he took each of his family and friends to look at lights and he was extremely proud of the magnificent display in his yard. He loved his pet "Snowball". He enjoyed landscaping and most especially loved logging everything and anything into his computer system.

Leveret loved his Armstrong Class of 1963. He was fond of each one and they likewise held him in high esteem. He enjoyed traveling with his class and talked with them regularly. He was a stranger to none. He would often laugh and joke with his doctors, nurses, persons that worked at his favorite coffee spot "Wawa". Leveret would often ask "do you think I'm too much of a clown" and he would continue to laugh and joke. He loved talking to his friends on the phone and became concerned if he did not have regular contact. He was constantly (as he described it) "on the move".

He is survived by his son, Leveret "Roger" Redd (Sudonna) and son's mother, Mary Jane Redd-Bohn; four grandchildren, Rochelle, Isaiah (devoted); Tremaine and Madyson; one sister, Delois "Charley" Lewis of Washington, DC; one brother, Lawrence Lewis (Toni) of Richmond; niece and nephew, Latisha Ann "TT" Lewis and Lawrence Lewis, Jr.; and great-niece, Lynn Lewis.
