LILLIAN DANIELS KEATON, one five daughters and four sons born of the union between the late Alexander Daniels and Louise Butts Daniels, was born on March 29, 1915 in Putnam County, Georgia. She transitioned peacefully in her sleep Saturday night, May 5, 2007. At an early age, Lillian and her family moved to Lincoln, North Carolina. She received her formal education in the public schools of Marion, North Carolina. There, as a young woman she met her first husband. It was out of this union that two sons, Levrette and Claude were born. She survived them both. Life continued for Lillian with constant evolution. Her first marriage ended and she later met and married Eugene Franklin Keaton in 1937. They traveled to Baltimore in 1942. Of this union came one son, Joseph R. Keaton. In 1943, Lillian joined Southern Baptist Church where she attended faithfully for almost sixty-four years. Until her recent decline in health, she served with dedication, giving her energy and efforts to various church organizations and functions. Her many certificates and plaques acknowledging appreciation for her dedication and tireless service to Southern Baptist Church are among her most treasured possessions. Lillian was a most willing worker. She retired from Baltimore City in 1984.
