After a brief stay in South Carolina she came to Baltimore, Maryland in her early teens with her family. Here she met and married the apple of her eye, Celess Myles. Lillian was a proud devoted wife and mother to their six children. Her husband and children were the focal point around which everything functioned. She will be most remembered for how easily she could create a warm environment for family, guests, friends and visitors to her home, which appeared at times to have a touch of elegance. Anyone who knew her, would find her in the neighborhood making a sacrifice of what goods she had on her own shelves in order to help some family less fortunate. She was a mother who gave to her children unselfishly. Many times, it meant going without certain things for herself. Her reward, as she would explain it, was to see her children happy and that meant the world to her. In 1956, Lillian accepted Al-Islam as her religion under the leadership of the Hon. Elijah Muhammad. And, in 1975, her faith became even stronger under the teaching and guidance of his son, Imam W. Deen Muhammad. Even though her health was failing her, she would always manage to smile when you would mention, "Nothing happens without Allah's Will." She is survived by her husband Celess Myles (known in the Muslim Community as

Bahar El-Amin); five children, Recco, Celestine, Lester, Arbar (deceased), Tynetta, and Tyran; one brother-in-law, Louis Myles; two sisters-in-law, Beatrice Myles and Pauline Stinnette; eleven grandchildren, Tesha, Reiko, Diego, Zarina, Arron, Shernell, Latoyah, Kendra, Fard, Erica, and Denyell (deceased); twenty-four great grandchildren and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends
