Rose made numerous friends wherever she went and will be sincerely missed by everyone who knew her. She was always a true friend, devoted mother and family member. Rose loved her family and spent a lot of time with them. She loved to dance, listen to music, cook and eat. “She was called on by many to cook them pigs feet or pigs ears and homemade potato salad!” Holidays were very special to Rose and as she prepared for them, she always had to wear the right “outfit” with matching accessories, of course, because she loved to shop too...often referring to the malls and grocery stores as her “second home.” Rose was baptized at Pleasant Hill Baptist Church in Lawrenceville, Virginia. She later joined Christ Temple Church, Inc., where she was an active member for many years. She was a loyal member of the Inspirational Choir, helped to cook and serve food, and participated in many of the activities at the

church. She is survived by her parents, George and Mary Williams; children, Andrea (a.k.a. Bootsia), Elyse (a.k.a. Lisa)Clemenzia (a.k.a. Jackie), and William (a.k.a.
