



Lillie Martha Cox

December 17, 1934 - September 25, 2017

Lillie Mae Cox, nee Howard, daughter of the late Jacob Dewitt and Lillie Martha Ann Howard, was born on December 17, 1934. She was the sixth of Seven children. Lillie attended Baltimore City Public Schools and graduated from Douglass High School, where she was voted best dressed. Upon graduation she attended Morgan State College. As a young adult, she worked at the segregated public pool in Druid Hill Park, and enjoyed bike riding and sewing.

In December 1957, Lillie married Sylvester B. Cox, Sr. and had one son, Sylvester B. Cox, Jr. Lillie worked in various jobs, as Sears and the Singer company, where she taught sewing classes. From 1968-1972, Lillie taught home economics at Pimlico Junior High. Lillie enjoyed teaching, as she was an excellent homemaker, cook and demonstrated expertise on the sewing machine. Her home was white glove spotless. My father described her as "antiseptic". During this time, she would also do seasonal work at the United States Post Office in downtown-Baltimore, as it was the custom of many people to earn extra income at the post office for the holiday season. In 1972, Lillie ended her teaching career and became an employee of the Post Office at the main building in Baltimore. She remained in their employ over 35 years. Lillie was an excellent mother, and with a firm hand , imparted old school values, insuring that her son received a quality education, and also insuring his involvement in various activities, throughout the year. year after year.

On Sundays she would surprise us and her neighbors, with a home cooked meal that may consist of liver and onions or beef ribs and potato salad. Or she would take the girls to lunch and a movie, attend their volleyball games, dance recitals and assemblies. She had no vices. She was all that a son could ask in a mother. She did things her way, and her way worked very well.

Lillie Mae Cox is survived by her son, The Honorable Sylvester B. Cox Jr., daughter-in-law Judy, granddaughters Lindsey and Erin, brother Jimmie Howard, goddaughter, Terry Howard, and a host of relatives and friends.
