LILLIE MAE SEABROOKS was born on May 4, 1916 in Fairfield County, South Carolina to the late Ernest and Mary Crumpton Trapp. Mae was the youngest of four daughters (Janie Morgan, Annie McKee and Alvenia Wallington) who were deeply devoted to each other and preceded her to glory. Mae entered peacefully into eternal rest on May 2, 2011 in York, Pennsylvania after a long illness.

She became a member of St. Matthew Baptist Church, Fairfield County, at an early age.

Mae married John A. Seabrooks in January of 1935 and from this union two children were born , James and Johnie Mae. She was preceded in death by her husband and her son. After moving to Baltimore she and her family joined Mount Pleasant Baptist Church and several years later she became a charter member of New Pilgrim Baptist Church. Mae attended Fairfield County Public Schools and in later years, she took courses in the Paul Laurence Dunbar High School evening programs. She held a variety of job beginning with Western Electric during World War II, later with Charles Antell, inc., and finally as a housekeeper for a local interior decorator.

She enjoyed attending service at New Pilgrim until she became unable to do so. She then looked forward to receiving the Church bulletin, visits from officer

and members and reading the Bible and her “Upper Room.”

Mae enjoyed sewing, cooking and gardening. Despite her loss of hearing in the recent years, she still loved to talk. Her outgoing personality and concern for other won her new friends wherever she went.

Her memory will be forever cherished by: her loving daughter, Johnie Mae Bispham; and son-in-law, Samuel Clifton Bispham. She was preceded in death by her son and daughter-in-law, James and Lois Seabrooks.
