meals  
for the homeless. She loved to give advice even when you didn’t want it. Linda  
enjoyed life, having fun with family and friends. She had a special bond with  
her  
late cousin Deloris Baker and Ronnie Thompson. They were like the three  
amigos.  
She also had a special bond with her niece Sherry Dicko and nephew Michael  
Slaughter. Linda loved seafood and cooking for her family and friends. She  
loved  
playing spades and would apologize to her rival partners before the game

saying, "I hate that I have to beat you in this game but please feel free to sign up for my spades class for lessons". Christmas was her favorite time of the year. She had to have an extremely large tree with all the decorations. But most importantly, it was a time to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ which was her first love. No matter what, both the highs and lows Linda faced in life, her faith always remained strong.
