



## Lindsey Rock

January 1, 1929 - September 3, 2018

Lindsey Rock was born on January 1, 1929 in Caroline County, Virginia to Annie Kate Wright and Richard Rock. He was called home on Monday, September 3, 2018 surrounded by family after enduring a battle with throat cancer. He was the seventh of eight children. He was preceded in death by his parents; three brothers, Walter T. Rock, John D. Rock, and Wilson Rock; four sisters, Christine Wright, Alto Gott, Hazel Booker, and Mary E. Thompson.

He was educated in Caroline County Public Schools before joining the United States Army. Lindsey served in World War II and the Vietnam War where he worked as a cook. After his Honorable Discharge, he went to work for Miller and Rhoads until his retirement. Lindsey married Constance "Dottee" Mitchell on July 28, 1976. His family remembers him as a kind man of few words. Whether it was talking about the happenings in the local news, cooking his famous chicken stew, or the caring for his wife, Lindsey made an impact on all those in his company.

Lindsey is survived by his devoted wife, Constance M. Rock of 42 years; sister-in-law, Laura Kincaid of Elizabethton, TN; brother-in-law, Aaron Frye Sr. of Fredericksburg, VA, and a host of nieces, nephews, relatives, and friends. Lindsey and Dottee were not biological parents, but played the role in the lives of so many including Sylvia Jiggetts-Seaborne (Raymond) and Derwin
